hai-tah tar'n'golet.... ha-tar'n'golet m'kar-ker-et bak-bak-bak.... *there was a hen.... the hen clucks bak bak bak...*

hai-tah parah.... ha-parah pu-ah.... *there was a cow.... the cow moos....*

hayah soos.... ha-soos tso-hayl.... *there was a horse.... the horse whinnies or neighs....*

hai-tah tsee-por.... ha-tsee-por m'tsaf-tse-fet... tseef tseef tseef.... *there was a bird ... the bird chirps tseef tseef ....*
